## **FIRE & POLICE COMMITTEE – Tom Fisher – (Chair)**

1. Fire Sirens – were installed by the end of January, the one at Eastend needs rewired. *There was a coil replaced in the unit on the East end.*
2. Base station and antenna installation in the radio room scheduled Centre Communications.
3. Gerry Perry, Brad Flick and Bill Miller agreed to no time variation on the sirens. *Steve Custer said he would donate his council pay toward stopping the sirens from 10pm to 6am from blowing.*
4. State awarded BVF - \$13,289.53 and Berlin Area Ambulance -\$9,192.44 as part of a grant from the Office of State Fire Commissioners on January 21, 2020.
5. Police have proposed new badge design for consideration. *Tom Fisher to setup meeting.*

## **ELECTRIC & EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE – Mike Lottig – (Chair)**

Generator Update – The generators report unavailable at this time (exhibit 7)

1. AMP update-AFEC Unit 1 electrical generator forced outage on January 1 will be inoperable until March 11, 2020 when extensive repairs and reassembly is complete.
2. AMP provided the 2019 Berlin Power usage which reflected a 0.5% decrease from 2018 actual usage. Based on the Peak demands from prior years and the positive weather for 2020 usage may be less during January and February. (Exhibit 8)
3. PowerSecure has tested DEF fluid and requested quotes for removal from generator tanks, future limitations set at 50% level.
4. Police car has been received and is in use.
5. The Motorola Radio is scheduled to ship to Team Force for installation.
6. AMP representative planned visit on ~~January~~ 13<sup>th</sup>. *February correct date.*
7. Berlin School has contracted East Hills engineering to review the current transformers and time for replacement and discussion with the borough to supply PAD mount transformer. In addition, the current door and security of the room and limited accessibility.
8. Release agreement received from property owner-804 Main St. to replace pole near sidewalk.
9. Release agreement for removal of tree at 806 Main St. due to change in electric lines.

## **HOUSE COMMITTEE – Stephen Custer – (Chair)**

1. Committee scheduled meeting for February 5<sup>th</sup>.
2. Flagpole installation is marked and to be installed weather permitting.
3. Verizon service and costs documented and compared to Comcast service for cost savings. *Tom J and Steve Custer reviewed services and proposed savings of \$800 month. Tom G – said he didn't think the savings were that high and hold contract to review. Steve Custer presented contract amount of 300-600 and savings of \$74 per month. Steve questioned Is it worth it.*
4. PennDOT Meeting that took place on January 29<sup>th</sup> – presented a 14-day detour through Berlin due to a bridge replacement on route 31 in 2021. (exhibit 9)
5. NSA – has issued a critical advisory notice impacting Microsoft Windows 10 and Windows Server 2019, and applications that rely on Windows. We have confirmed our software is updated and secure. (exhibit 10)

## **STREETS, STORM SEWERS & SIDEWALK – Thomas Jones – (Chair)**

Cumberland Street Update.

- a. Darr Construction to finish landscaping work along sidewalk weather permitting.

- b. Water Authority approved and have been invoiced \$27,300 to be approved.
- 2. East Main St – Columbia Gas project– Phase II** - Requested potential start date.
- 3. East Main St – Columbia Gas project – Phase I** -12<sup>th</sup> Avenue to Cassel in front of school.
  - a. Columbia Gas notified Tom G that their permit submitted to PennDOT was included in a larger permit request that includes Cumberland St and 10<sup>th</sup> Avenue.
  - b. Scoping meeting scheduled for February 7 in Hollidaysburg.
  - c. School reviewed proposed 11<sup>th</sup> Avenue entrance and would like to present to the school board to gain approval for easement and lighting.
  - d. Steve Dratter – agreed to proposed crosswalk with 11<sup>th</sup> avenue entrance plan.
  - e. Permit requested to replace 9 waterlines in this area – PennDOT notified Tom G that depending upon the amount of pavement disturbed they may require complete section to be paved, not in the agreement with the Water Authority. Direction required?
- 4. Diamond street project** — CDBG funds project.
  - a. Committee Meeting 01/30/2020 –AEG, Tom Jones, Cliff Horner and Tom Glessner reviewed proposed plans and direction for the meeting.
  - b. Scoping meeting scheduled for February 7 in Hollidaysburg.
  - c. Meeting with the County Commissioners on January 29<sup>th</sup>, we discussed the timing and requirements for this project and demands from PennDOT. Commissioners were meeting with PennDOT on February 3<sup>rd</sup> and will discuss this project.
  - d. AEG initiated survey and planning for this project plan to be completed for it to be bid in concurrence with the Main St. project.
- 5. Main Street Revitalization.**
  - a. The project is 85% complete and proposed dates have been requested for bidding.
  - b. Tree cutting on Main Street – completed by borough Employees.
  - c. 5 of the 6 poles have been replaced and electric lines are being transferred to new poles in preparation of the project.
  - d. Lights from American Gas have now been approved, but different poles are required from an approved PennDOT vendor.
  - e. The antique light in front of the Lutheran Church needs to be addressed within the project.
  - f. Sidewalk thickness in front of the Church and Luther House.
- 6. Columbia Gas project Phase III** – Project includes Cumberland street to 10<sup>th</sup> avenue and additional 10<sup>th</sup> avenue sections.
  - a. Columbia Gas plan is to put back as is, without curb or raising of Sidewalks.
  - b. PennDOT will determine if they will approve separation of permit to accommodate Phase II project for the borough.
- 7. Dale Werner Variance request** – New plans submitted requesting 10 ft. from Powell’s property line but still requests variance to the street, which was sent to Solicitor to contact and present to Powell’s attorney.
- 8. Valley Road** – Municipal Authority request repairs to the road for ease in accessibility.
  - a. Shale the road – initiated on 2/5/2020.

*Main St. water lines from 11<sup>th</sup> to 12<sup>th</sup> avenue replacement. Based on amount of roadway disturbed may require additional paving on one side.*

*Tom to get estimate for milling and paving if required.*

*NPL to do their portion of street paving out white horse road.*

*Mike Lottig and Tom Fisher discussion to continue over Powell’s*

*Valley Road - Continue to repair the road.*

*Charles suggested contacting terry Tallion from Somerset Soil Conservation regarding the repair and possible replacement of the road.*

*Snyder’s – Bob Heyman in charge*
