Steve Spochart – explained the Diamond St. project and AEG cost proposal. He recommended the Council approve the \$21,767 for engineering and use the funds provided from the commissioners for construction. If we add the Main St. project portion of the lower diamond to diamond St. it would cost an additional \$5,000 for AEG. He expects the funds to go to Washington St. and possibly do more in the lower Diamond.

Markus and Josh – presented to Council the expansion of the Berlin office is a hub location and future plans. The Berlin office is the 2nd largest branch, its employees 23 graduates from Berlin 2 are current residents. 5% of the workforce is from Somerset county. 24 emp's are from Meyersdale. Somerset Trust donated \$42,000 in 2019. They have watched competitors

and businesses leave town and they are still very strong. Josh suggested we contact Marcus with any issues.

Josh continued with the expansion in 2019 included offices in Uniontown, Shellsburg, and Greensburg.

The Berlin office includes all interior changes and no exterior changes.

Somerset trust has been in business for 131 years and in the cook family. Three of the family intend to retire in 2020, as this is a 6th generation business.

Charles made a recommendation for the Wes Lewis Jr as he is interested on being on the Municipal Authority. He has made gates, worked at the sewer plant, lives in Brothersvalley township. Mike Brant moved into Bunny Bauchis home.
