GARBAGE COMMITTEE – John Harding – (Chair) Tom Glessner read

1. County commissioners have suspended recycling service, effective March 13. Plans are to restructure the services and Tom G has been working with commissioners to investigate some alternatives. The Berlin Borough may continue to keep the building and recycle. The committee will meet to determine future direction.

ELECTRIC & EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE – Mike Lottig – (Chair)

1. Generator Update – The generators operated for 2 hour and 6 minutes in Test Mode and 45 minutes of that time was with load. (exhibit 1)
2. The 2020 projected peak is 2,849 and year to date we have achieved the following between 2573 and 2666 between the month of December and January for future peak shaving.
3. School meeting scheduled for 2/18/2020 – transformer project requirements, timing, and issues to be discussed. (Door replacement, 3 vents, 2 transformers are leaking oil), future inspection during scheduled shutdown.
4. Main Street will require an electric outage (5-7 hrs.) in preparation of revitalization project. To be scheduled in the next couple weeks weather permitting.
5. On February 13th Tom G meet with AMP representative and update on AMP and proposed meter system.
6. The new radio was installed in the Police car on February 13th.
7. The new police car is not equipped with camera system, or vascar and the cost to transfer car 10 camera to car 12 is \$1,000 and a new camera system is \$5,000. vascar is an additional cost to transfer to car 12.

Motion by Steve Custer and seconded by Cliff Horner to approve Transfer of camera system from car 10 to car 12 for police in the amount of \$1000.00.

FIRE & POLICE COMMITTEE – Tom Fisher – (Chair)

1. Base station for the fire sirens is scheduled for February 24th in the radio room, a new antenna will be installed on the roof.
2. Police Badge review for committee meeting.
3. Fire Sirens – to be inspected for consistent operation.
4. 2019 school contract will end in March and the new contract will begin.

Steve Custer asked if it is less than \$5,000 to not have sirens go off during night hours. The cost to change the fire sirens to not operate during 10pm to 6 am is \$1200 for each siren for a total cost of \$2,400. Steve said he will contribute toward the cost. The grant money for the school contract has not been approved yet, it is anticipated to be \$30,000 this year.

- 4. Columbia Gas project Phase III – SR160 Seg0370 Offset 0700 to Seg0380 Offset 2700.**
 - a. Discussion with PennDOT – confirms Columbia Gas application is all inclusive.
 - b. Tom G contacted Columbia Gas and request breaking their application into 2 parts.
 - c. Columbia Gas – sidewalk raise to curb and installation of curb requirement unknown.
- 5. Diamond street project — Redevelopment authority funds \$244,405.**
 - a. Scoping meeting with PennDOT in Hollidaysburg on February 7, 2020.
 - b. AEG initiated Survey and Application process, permit to be prepared prior to the Main St. project, bike lane to be determined.
 - c. PennDOT approved the use of funds for the adjoining side of the lower diamond and Chris Hull agreed with the majority of the plan, but lighting could not be separated.
- 6. Main Street Revitalization.**
 - a. AEG to update diamond St effect on Main Street project.
 - b. Streets committee to review application and Diamond Street direction.
 - c. Streets committee to review PennDOT approved poles for approval by council.
 - d. Roger Clarke request for heated sidewalk was denied from PennDOT.
 - e. Carol Clarke – requested traffic light installed at the lower diamond.
- 7. Dale Werner Variance request-194 West Main St. to build a garage**
 - a. Jason Huston submitted proposal for street variance and property variance of 10ft from Powell’s property line. Solicitor sent proposal to Boose – Powell’s attorney.
- 8. Ruth Saylor – Driveway installation request 824 Maple St.**
 - a. The builder would like to install cement driveway to the road across utility ROW.

The 11th avenue entrance at the school is a proposed change with your packet. We need to determine if it will be approved by PennDOT.

HOUSE COMMITTEE – Stephen Custer – (Chair)

1. Committee meeting discussed the proposed Comcast cost comparison and direction.
 - a. 4-6 months to complete line installation for the Sewer Plant.
2. Comcast to install additional transfer box across the street at the Borough building.

Comcast had some outage and requested a splitter box be installed on our pole across the street to break up the service area. They will put an additional power box
