FIRE & POLICE COMMITTEE – Tom Fisher – (Chair)

1. Fire Siren at the West end of town waiting on controller to be replaced.
2. School contract final billing in March. Limited SRO activity during school shutdown.

ELECTRIC & EQUIPMENT COMMITTEE – Mike Lottig – (Chair)

Generator Update – The generators report unavailable at this time.

1. PowerSecure continues to monitor the generators and send notices.
2. The First Energy Customer Guide for Electric Service – was adopted on October 3, 2019.
3. Rental property at 419 5th avenue the water line has been replaced four times - caused by electrical issues from within the property. (Exhibit 6)
4. Main Street electric outage (5-7 hrs.) in preparation of revitalization project is scheduled to be in the next few weeks.
5. Pole replaced at 806 Main St due to change in electric line location and future sidewalks.
6. The pine trees at Bingman's behind the Penelec substation have been cut down.

Baltzer rental property should have been billed for the water line service from the borough due to the electric service issues at 419 5th.

Because the amount of issues and the concern for the residents the electric issues must be corrected. Council agreed to Red Tag the service and make sure the upgrade is complete on inside problems. It will require an inspection.

HOUSE COMMITTEE – Stephen Custer – (Chair)

1. Comcast installation for the Sewer Plant – reviewed pole diagram. (Exhibit 7)
2. Flagpole installation is marked and to be installed weather permitting.
3. Electronic recycling – confirm with JVS proposed dates of May 16th and October 24th.
4. Census 2020 – April 1st, 2020 was the first day to register, you may have received a notice and a reminder in the mail already for Census Day. As of march, 28th there were 26,100 households in Somerset county that have not responded. Berlin Borough has 62.2% residents that have **NOT** self-responded. (exhibit 8)

Steve Custer spoke to JVS regarding the proposed dates.

STREETS, STORM SEWERS & SIDEWALK – Thomas Jones – (Chair)

Committee meeting on March 17th, Steve Spochart, Tom Jones, Tom G. and Chadd Sines and Kevin Yoder from AEG. The dates associated with the projects had no change to the Main St project, Columbia Gas phase I plans from AEG were delayed from March 13th and were to be submitted beginning of the next week March 23rd. Diamond Street

update 2' stamped and 5' sidewalk, pole location changes and Verizon contact. AEG to provide updated cost estimate for Columbia Gas phase I and Diamond Street.

1. Cumberland Street Update

- a. Darr Construction to finish landscaping work along sidewalk weather permitting.

2. East Main St – Columbia Gas project– Phase II –

- a. MandB Construction has communicated delay due to shut down.

3. East Main St – Columbia Gas project – Phase I -12th Ave to Cassel.

- a. Subsurface work was halted on all permits, thus delaying replacing 9 waterlines.
- b. AEG provided plan documents and files on March 24th
- c. Application #210197 submitted to PennDOT on March 26th.
- d. School Agreement submitted to PennDOT for lighting and sidewalk.
- e. Solicitor letter regarding 1125 and 1127 Main St. submitted to PennDOT.
- f. AEG to provide updated cost estimate to Tom G. for Columbia Gas agreement.
- g. AEG suggests bidding **Contract 2020-G-01** before permit is received. (exhibit 9)
- h. Columbia Gas has not received permit for this area as of March 26.

4. Diamond street project — CDBG funds project.

- a. AEG created initial plans and surveying and now they will begin updating the week of April 6th or the 13th after the Main St project is submitted.
- b. Verizon engineering contacted on March 26th scheduled initial review on March 31st.
- c. Verizon engineer Jason, Brian W. and Tom G. meet March 31 to review and address pole locations and the large amount of underground connections, sidewalk replacement, and parking area all under review by Verizon.
- d. Verizon to confirm pole behind their building for resident service at 416 4thavenue. Plan is for this project to be bid prior to and completed prior to or in concurrence with the Main St. project.

5. Main Street Revitalization.

- a. The project was 85% complete and comments received from PennDOT, Kevin and Chris phone conversation on March 31 has addressed various issues and dates.
- b. Kevin and Steve emails dated March 31 confirmed that the dates would change for the project. Submission date of April 2nd for 100% is now April 10th. The Let date is June 18th, provided there are no more delays.
- c. Lighting was approved in January and PennDOT has reviewed and requested changes.
- d. 1 of the 6 electric poles still to be replaced at upper diamond for the project exact location.
- e. Chris responsible for the project had to report that future delays would jeopardize funding.

6. Columbia Gas project Phase III – Cumberland street to 10th avenue.

- a. Columbia Gas application has not been resubmitted to PennDOT as of March 26th.
- b. Current plan is to put back as is, without curb or raising of Sidewalks.

7. September 11th National Memorial Trail

- a. Somerset County Commissioners request Berlin Borough's permission to install PennDOT approved signage along the right-of-way on Meyers Street, High Street, Fletcher Street, and Diamond Street.
