Electric & Equipment

Tree Trimming

In an effort to anticipate problems before they create an outage, Borough Crews have been working with Wiedenhoft Electric to trim those trees that present a clear and present danger to both public safety and our power distribution grid.

There is much more to be done on this but we addressed the worst areas last week.

GOAB Project

The west circuit GOAB is completed and we are about to cut-in the re-closer switch. Next we will move to the Center Circuit which will involve several pole replacements along the way.

Phase Balancing

We have quite a bit of work to do here in that all three borough circuits have significant phase unbalance issues with the West Circuit being the worst. Correcting this requires load changes that must be done carefully to avoid any service interruptions.

Infrastructure Asset Inventory

We hope to start this process on 061114 with the addition of our new summer intern.

We are, however, faced with a number of process options:

Option One: Go with AMP on their turn-key inventory for a whopping \$58,917.98

Option Two: Piggyback with AMP with local data gathering and AMP data input into ESRI ARC/GIS for a mere \$27,772.40

Option Three: Purchase the ESRI ARC/GIS software and do the entire process locally for \$7000 plus additional modules and training. ESRI ARC/GIS is the industry standard that provides a level on complexity and sophistication that would be nice but is perhaps more than we need or can afford.

Option Four: Compile the database locally and overlay the data onto Google Maps Engine Pro for \$150 per year.

Infrastructure Asset Inventory (See Exhibit P27)
